When Michael and Michaela were swimming, he had almost drowned her, not realizing it, from re-enacting one of his wrestling moves. Michael and Michaela had lots of crazy adventures as children. One of the times, Michael and Michaela were not listening to their mom when she told them to buckle up while she quickly went into the store, when the two of them jumped into the front seat. Michaela's foot had hit the stick shift and the vehicle started rolling back and Michael had grabbed the wheel and turned it. The vehicle bumped into a tree but if it wasn't for Michael they would have driven into oncoming traffic. In 2018, shortly after his mother's passing, Michael cooked an Easter dinner and invited his close friends and family.
