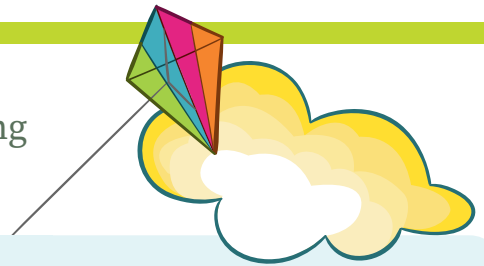

## Activity

### Breakfast with Jesus

#### What You Need

#### What You Do

Retell the Bible story below and guide children to perform the actions as you retell the story. Read it again asking kids to help you retell it by periodically asking "What happened next?" as you retell the story.

**"In our Bible story today, Jesus' friends were fishing in a boat. (Pretend to hop in a boat. Next, pretend you're fishing by casting your rod into the water and reeling in a big fish.) They looked over to the sandy beach and saw someone. Look with me. (Put hand over eyes and look.) It was their good friend, Jesus! Jesus is alive! They quickly got out of the boat and went to see Jesus. Follow me! (Pretend to jump out of the boat. Now, pretend to swim towards Jesus.) Jesus' friends were so happy to see Him. (Shout "Hip, Hip, Hooray!" several times.) Jesus made them breakfast on the beach. They all sat around and ate and talked. (Pretend to sit by the fire and eat food.). It was the best day ever!" (Give two thumbs up.)**

**Tell Kids (after the activity):** "Jesus went to see His friends because He wanted them to know that He is alive, and wants to be their friend forever. Jesus wants to be your friend forever, too!"
