#### Crisis Pregnancy Centers

The opportunity to help families navigating a crisis pregnancy is one that 12Stone has been engaged with for years. Two of our partners, Choices Pregnancy Care Center (choicespregnancy. org) and Obria Medical Clinics (obria.org) provide support for the physical, spiritual, emotional and social needs of families navigating a crisis pregnancy. An investment of \$25K allows these organizations to increase their capacity to meet needs.

### Food Insecurity in 12Stone Home Cities

We have 12Stone Home Gatherings in several cities where food insecurity is a pressing issue. We will invest \$5000 in 4 cities (Charleston, SC; Dallas, TX; Port Orchard, Washington & Spokane, Washington) to serve these families in need.

### Equip

12Stone and Equip have an ongoing partnership to train believers to share their faith withing their circles of influence, often in the business community. The goal for Equip in 2023 is to see 400,000 decisions for Christ this year. A \$100K investment moves this initiative forward.

### **Global Missions**

12Stone Church has always had a heart to serve in Global Mission work and that DNA runs deep within members of our church family. Here are three examples of how God has called others into bringing more people to Christ.

In January 2020, Wally and Joy Grant sold everything they owned, including their home, and followed God's call to serve as house parents at the Amazima School in Jinja, Uganda. At the time, the Grants were serving at 12Stone's Buford Campus. Wally, who turns 70 in May, continues to share with many that when they retire, God has chosen to repurpose them.

Mark and Megan Musick were both in 12Stone's residency program. Just before completing their two years in the spring of 2021, Mark and Megan responded to God's prompting and began preparing to serve in London. Mark shares the gospel as an American Football coach, and Megan serves in a refugee center in a borough outside of London.

Jennifer Bennett was on a 12Stone mission trip to Nigeria in 2007 when God clarified that she was to move there as a missionary. Jennifer returned to the US and completed her education as a Nurse Practitioner. After living for several years in Nigeria, God moved Jennifer to Nairobi, Kenya, where she continues to serve. Jennifer leads medical clinics for orphaned and vulnerable children through the Least of These ministry.
