Key Thoughts and Reflections:

- I. Everything bows to an authority. Ours is the Bible.
 - Q: Who do you trust to give you advice?
 - Q: Who, if anyone, do you see as a figure of authority in your life?
 - Q: Do you trust the authority of the Bible? Why or why not?
- II. The Bible was written for us, not just to us.
 - Q: God wrote the Bible with you in mind. What does that make you think/feel?
 - Q: Do you have your own method for studying the Bible? How'd you come to it?
 - Q: Do you feel confident reading the Bible? Do you leave with a deeper understanding of it?
- III. First, I read God's word, then I invite God's word to read me. (Scripture, Observation, Application, Prayer)
 - Q: The SOAP method is a simple method to approach the Bible. Reading the Scripture is step one. How do you go about choosing which Scripture to read in your personal time?
 - Q: Observation is about understanding audience, characters, context, and the purpose of the passage. From your experience, what's a Bible passage you understood more after observation?
 - Q: Application is about applying what you learned about God through the passage in your own life. What's something God has been teaching you lately?
