Generational Differences | Embracing Passion, Influence, & Wisdom

That's what we see in 2 Chronicles 34 one moment in history where God uses a passionate young king, a faithful middle-aged priest, and a wise older prophetess to bring change to an entire country. It wasn't one person or one age group that changed everything—it was the generations showing up *together*. They each brought what they had and that was enough.

This isn't just a story of the past. It's a picture of what is possible when passion, influence, and wisdom come together. Every generation carries something the others need. The result? As Dan Reiland says it, "Diversity + Unity = Strength." This is the beauty of church community, each generation coming together for the glory of God.

Q: Joshiah chose a different path than his father and grandfather. Have you ever felt the pressure to become something else because of your family, your past, or your environment?Q: Passion is contagious. Who is someone whose passion for Jesus has lit something in you?

II. Godly Influence - Middle Generation

Q: Hilkiah wasn't the king, but his influence helped change a nation. Where do you believe God has placed you to carry influence?

Q: Do you struggle to believe your influence matters? What are the subtle ways you're tempted to check out emotionally or spiritually?

Q: Hilkiah helped bridge Josiah's passion with Huldah's wisdom. Who is someone that you could come alongside right now?

III. Godly Wisdom - Older Generation

Q: What is something that God has taught you through your life experience that you wish to tell younger generations?

Q: Spiritual wisdom does not retire. Where in your life have you been tempted to step back, minimize your voice, or assume "someone else" will lead?

Q: Huldah spoke with courage, not just comfort. When has God has asked you to say something difficult, not to be harsh – but to be faithful? Did you say it?

Q: Who is a younger person God has placed in your life who needs your encouragement or perspective right now? How can you intentionally create a moment to speak life into then this week?
