Irene Guembe Ibañez (Spain - 100 Miles - 100M - first place female): "I feel quite good. At the beginning, I had better sensations. The first part felt easier, the second part - tougher. I had stomach problems, and I felt that the race slowed down a bit more in the second part. The landscape is beautiful, it's gorgeous although it's true that there was bad weather at times and we couldn't see it, but without a doubt, the best part of the race is the place where it's held. I came because in the summer I try to run a race outside my country and take the opportunity to have a vacation, and my intention was to qualify for Chamonix. And I came to spend 10 days on vacation here."

Daniel Jung (Italy - Endurance Trail - 100K - first place male):

"I feel very well. The course was tough today. It was raining and the terrain was very slipery. And there were a lot of clouds in the mountains, so it was a challenge to find course at times. But it was really cool, I liked it and I didn't expect it to be such a great course. And I am looking forward to coming back next year. I enjoyed the most the technical parts, because I am from South Tirol and I live in the mountains so I always train only at technical terrain and never flat. My next goal is to finish UTMB which I will run this year and then I will do Mallorca by UTMB and after HOKA Chiang Mai Thailand by UTMB."

Fernanda Maciel (Brazil - 82K Oso - 100K - first place female):


"It's a very technical and a high altitude race, I mean very high; also with a very high level of athletes. There are 2800 runners of which 1000 are women, which is really great. The organization is very good, all the trails are well marked and there is forest, there is a mountain, a bit of everything. I felt very good during the race, calm and I was able to lead from the beginning. I am very happy."

Tyler Andrews (USA - 82K Oso - 100K - first place male):

"I feel super at home here in Quito. I remember the moment when my friend Joaquín López sent me a message in September or October last year and told me 'yes, there's a UTMB race in Ecuador' and I said 'I have to go because Quito is my city. I feel at home here. The course was a bit of everything because we started in Mindo which is full jungle, cloud forest at almost a thousand meters, full humidity, full jungle, full mud and then we climbed up to the páramo at almost 4000 meters by the cable car area, so you pass through many different climates, different types of terrain, different types of trails. There are super narrow trails, there are parts that are like roads so it has everything: 100% Ecuadorian experience."
