

From the Swiss Alps to the Julian Alps, **UTMB World Series head to majestic peaks**

A wild ride awaits at Wildstrubel by UTMB



Straight off the back of what is going to be an unforgettable event at HOKA UTMB[®] Mont-Blanc, UTMB[®] World Series continues on a high as it heads to the northern Alps of Switzerland for Wildstrubel by UTMB[®].

On 12-15 September, **over 5,430** participants will discover the region's wild peaks and manicured mountain pastures via famous alpine passes, lakes and quaint towns full of local charm.

Elite Runners to watch

A complete tour of the Wildstrubel Massif and the Plaine Morte Glacier is on the cards for the Wild 110 (100M) competitors, crossing the two cantons of Valais and Bern via mythical passes. In the women's elite field, Kristyna Cerna (AUT, UTMB Index 719) has already secured two UTMB World Series podiums in 2024 and looks good to secure the triple this September. **Bastien Jannetta** (FRA, UTMB Index 799) will make his UTMB World Series debut in Switzerland. He heads into the race with the highest UTMB Index, but faces tough opposition in Arnaud Lejeune (FRA, UTMB Index 797) and Lucien Bourquin (SUI, UTMB Index 787).

In the Wild 70 (100K), Julie Roux (FRA, UTMB Index 767) and Eliot Retuli (FRA, UTMB Index 855) look to be the ones to beat in their respective categories. Victoria Stansfield (GBR, UTMB Index 705) is new to the trail running scene but shouldn't be underestimated. Despite making her debut on the trails this summer, she has already secured two impressive wins in the mountains and could be set for a solid result on her first UTMB World Series outing.

Stansfield said, "My family and I have been spending the summer traveling through the Alps. Switzerland in particular is my favourite of the European mountain regions. The Wild 70 really appeals to me because it offers stunning scenery and significant elevation gain, both of which I was looking for in a race. What I am most looking forward to is reaching the top of the final climb, knowing that my one-year-old will be waiting for me at the bottom.

I don't have any specific performance goals for this race - I am going in with an open mind. As someone who is very new to the sport, with just two races under my belt, Wild 70 is about establishing a benchmark that my coach, Doug Stewart, and I can build on. My main goal, as with every race, is to be grateful for the opportunity to compete and look forward to seeing my family at the finish line."

An action-packed race is expected in the Wild 50 (50K). Sophia Laukli (USA, UTMB Index 789), Candice Fertin (FRA, UTMB Index 751) and Emily Schmitz (USA, UTMB Index 736) will be amongst the protagonists at the front of the race in the women's elite field. Anthony Felber (FRA, UTMB Index 885) heads into the race as the top-ranked in the men elite field but Sammy Chelangat (KEN, UTMB Index 864) will be one to watch. Under the guidance of coach Julien Lyon, whose project is to train young Kenyan athletes in mountain running, Chelangat has already turned heads with an impressive win at Trail Alsace Grand Est by UTMB[®] earlier this year.

A fiery pace is also expected in the Wild 25 (20K), with Marion Delespierre Mauppin (FRA, UTMB Index 759) and Alessandro Riva (ITA, UTMB Index 827) predicted to be leading the charge in their respective categories.

With a 10K fun run - new for this 2024 edition, plus a children's race and an inclusive adaptive athlete race, the event promises a weekend full of celebrations and achievements in the Swiss Alps.

Record-numbers at Julian Alps Trail Run by UTMB



The UTMB World Series heads from the Swiss Alps to the mighty peaks and glacialformed blue waters of the Julian Alps in Slovenia on 20-22 September.

Julian Alps Trail Run by UTMB[®] heads into a record-breaking year, with over 3,500 athletes registered and ready to discover highlights such as Lake Bled, Triglav National Park and Slovenia's highest summit - Mount Triglav - at 2,864m.

Race Director, Luke Hren said, "We couldn't be more excited about our biggest edition yet. Participants are for an incredible adventure, discovering this most authentic part of the Alps through trail running. They'll enjoy breathtaking views of the fairytale and world-famous Lake Bled and the iconic mount Triglav, experience the incredible local hospitality and friendliness of the event, which is one of the many reasons runners keep returning year after year."

Elite Runners

Local trail runners are seizing the opportunity to race a UTMB World Series event on home trails. Two athletes looking to take the tape in front of a home crowd in the 100M race -I FEEL SLOVENIA JAT ULTRA TRAIL 120 km- include the 2023 170km men's winner, Ivan Hrastovec (SLO, UTMB Index 821) and the 2022 runner-up in the women's 50K race, Martina Klancnik Potrč (SLO, UTMB Index 724).

Azara Garcia de los Salmones (ESP, UTMB Index 780) is no stranger to the topstep in trail races, but a UTMB World Series podium currently evades her in 2024. She heads into the JAT LAKE BLED 80 km (100K) women's race as the favourite and will be looking to hold off the likes of Dominique van Mechgelen (BEL, UTMB Index 706). In the men's race, it could be a close match between the 2023 50K runner-up, Janez Klancnik (SLO, UTMB Index 813) and 2022 50K winner Jiri Petr (CZE, UTMB Index 815) who is back for redemption after suffering a DNF in the 100K race last year.

Yoel de Paz (ESP, UTMB Index 887) is the one to beat in the JAT SKY TRAIL 50 km (50K). He will race in Slovenia for the first time, alongside Luca Pescollderungg (ITA, UTMB Index 856). Meanwhile, Sophia Laukli looks set to be lining herself up for a very exciting September, with her name on the start list for both UTMB World Series events that month and a strong contender in both. Anna Tarasova (ESP, UTMB Index 734) also heads into the race as a favourite, especially after her **dominating win at Trail 100 Andorra™ by UTMB[®] 50K** last month.

After the inspiration from the recent HOKA UTMB Mont-Blanc event, athletes from around the world will be seizing their opportunity to stamp their spot for next year's edition of the event, or gain Running Stones to enter into the lottery.
