**HOKA UTMB Mont-Blanc: A French triumph** at the TDS for Marie Dohin and Thibault Marquet while the Juniors shine before the **UTMB World Series Finals get underway** 

After setting off on Monday evening from Courmayeur in an atmosphere crackling with excitement and palpable tension, the runners taking part in the TDS® have almost all crossed the finish line. Today, Chamonix hosted the YCC The Revenge and the Mini UTMB, providing an enthusiastic backdrop for the exploits of the young trail runners. Today also marks D-1 for the OCC which will see 1,200 runners set off at 08:15 tomorrow morning, setting the tone for the UTMB® World Series Finals.

## The French take centre stage at the TDS


At 23:50 on Monday evening, 1,874 athletes set off from Courmayeur for the TDS challenge: 148km with 9,306m D+ on a particularly technical course. Hot weather conditions conspired to make this edition even more demanding, testing the determination of the runners. In both the women's and men's categories, the TDS saw several French athletes stand out:

Thibault Marquet (FRA - UTMB Index 847), based in the Beaufortain region, mastered the difficult course and the heat to reach Chamonix in 18h59'36", almost an hour ahead of fellow countrymen Alban Berson (FRA - UTMB Index 827) who completed the course in 19h26'40" and Gautier Airiau (FRA - UTMB Index 862) who finished in 20h07'22". At the finish line, Thibault Marquet said: "It was flowing, an incredible day! I'm very

proud to have won this race and to have done it this way, deep down I was always hoping for a podium finish. I took the lead at Cormet de Roselend, and then I was carried along by the public as I passed through Beaufortain, where I live. The end of the race was harder, but fortunately I hadn't realised, otherwise I probably wouldn't have finished as strong." The women also put up a magnificent fight, inspired by the beauty of the Beaufortain landscapes and the support of the public in the villages and along the route.

A few minutes after finishing, Marie Dohin said: "I'm delighted with my victory today, because I wasn't expecting it! ## Tomorrow the UTMB World Series Finals get underway with the OCC

Since its launch in 2014, the OCC has rallied residents, elected representatives and

volunteers of the Val d'Entremont area - an unspoilt mountain valley in the west of the canton of Valais - to offer a warm welcome to the runners along the 57km and 3,500m D+ course. The route winds through authentic Valais villages, starting with Orsières and its many hamlets, then Champex-Lac and Trient. During the second part of the route, athletes will experience the exceptional scenery of the eastern side of the Mont-Blanc massif, including the Col de Balme with its breathtaking panorama of the Aiguilles de Chamonix, and the demanding ascent of La Flégère, before arriving at the heart of Chamonix itself. This latest edition of the OCC marks the start of the UTMB World Series Finals, the

Other runners to watch include Judith Wyder (SUI - UTMB Index 792), first at the Mont Blanc Marathon 2024 and second on the 50K course at Kullamannen™ by UTMB® last November; Adeline Martin(FRA - UTMB Index 755), third at the 2024 European Championships; and Miao Yao (CHN -UTMB Index 785), third last year at the OCC and third also at the Mont Blanc Marathon 2024. In the men's category, a battle is expected between Switzerland's Rémi Bonnet (UTMB Index 948), first in July at the 50K Restonica Trail by UTMB® and world

number 1 in the UTMB Index; England's Jonathan Albon(UTMB Index 933), 2019 Trail World Champion who last year won the CCC® after an epic final against China's Jiasheng SHEN (UTMB Index 904); and Italy's Francesco Puppi (UTMB Index 919), second last year at the OCC and determined to reclaim top spot in this year's rankings. The two Frenchmen Sylvain Cachard (UTMB Index 914), 2022 European mountain running champion and all-time best French performer at Sierre-Zinal in 2h32'45", and Benjamin Roubiol (UTMB Index 902), 2023 world long-distance trail champion and 2024 European vice-champion, are also ones to watch.
