Spotlight on Malaysia, Hong Kong and Australia as UTMB World Series celebrates debut events, iconic locations and remarkable athletes


UTMB[®] World Series is set for an exhilarating November, as the spotlight turns to the Asia-Pacific region. From the rugged beauty of Hong Kong's largest island at TransLantau by $\mathsf{UTMB}^{\circledR}$, to the highly-anticipated debut of Malaysia $\mathsf{Ultra}\text{-}\mathsf{Trail}^{\intercal M}$ by UTMB[®] and inspiring stories of bravery and resilience ahead of Ultra-Trail Kosciuszko™ by UTMB®, this action-packed month will showcase trail running and its community at its best.

UTMB World Series returns to Hong Kong's largest island for TransLantau by UTMB



Over 2,500 runners will head to the wild and rugged beauty of Lantau Island, Hong Kong on 8-10 November as they prepare to take on IransLantau by UIMB.

With the trail running scene continuing to grow in Hong Kong, the event allows runners to experience the UTMB World Series close to home, with over 60% of entrants coming from the local area.



Elite runners

Min Qi (CHN, UTMB Index 836) is looking to end the season on a high in the 100M after struggling over the longer distances this year. He will line-up alongside top talent, including Terunobu Kurokawa (JPN, UTMB Index 823) and Zhaoying Liu (CHN, UTMB Index 803). In the women's race, Lin Chen (CHN, UTMB Index 741) comes into the race off the back of an impressive fourth place finish at UTMB®. Ki Chun Wong (CHN, UTMB Index 683) is also amongst the favorites, and has experience on her side having finished second in the 100K race in 2023.

The top-ranked female athlete in Hong Kong, Man Yee Cheung (HKG, UTMB Index 677) is seizing the opportunity to race on home soil, taking on the 100K race. She will face strong international competition, including Natalia Mastrota (ITA, UTMB Index 676) and Aurore Dacier (FRA, UTMB Index 676). The men's race also features a talent of international athletes, with local favorite Ho Chung Wong (HKG, UTMB Index 788) looking to challenge for a podium spot ahead of top-ranked Anders Kjaerevik (NOR, UTMB Index 889) and Disi Liang (CHN, UTMB Index 795).

In the 50K, a close battle is expected between athletes such as Claudio Díaz-Castán (ESP, UTMB Index 857) and Yutaro Yokouchi (JPN, UTMB Index 821). In the women's race, top athletes include Yuri Yoshizumi (JPN, UTMB Index 746) and Marta Perez Maroto (ESP, UTMB Index 701). The spotlight is also on Hong-Kong based athlete, **Veronika Leng** (SVK, UTMB

Index 720). After a tough DNF at the 2022 HOKA UTMB® Mont-Blanc - CCC® due to an unknown pregnancy, she made an incredible comeback to the race in 2024 as a new mum, securing 11th place. She said, "It feels amazing being back to racing and feeling strong physically and mentally after having a baby just over a year ago. It didn't happen overnight for me,

and it took many months to feel ready for it again. Beside hours of consistent

training, it also takes an incredible amount of mental strength and sacrifice to

compete at an elite level, especially as a new mother. If you are not 100% in it, there

is no chance of getting on top again. I feel so lucky to have the needed support here in Hong Kong and be able to get back to training and racing this year." Another exceptional athlete to look out for on the start list is Miao Yao (CHN, UTMB Index 796), who will be looking for a win in the women's category of the **20K** race. The talented athlete has secured a victory at the HOKA UTMB Mont-Blanc - OCC this year, alongside the CCC in 2018. In the men's race, Riccardo Scalet



Malaysia, this marks a significant milestone for the growing trail running community. In 2024, more than 100 Malaysian runners entered the UTMB World Series lottery, despite the absence of a UTMB World Series race on home soil. This new event will further enhance accessibility and allow runners to chase their dreams. **Elite runners**



In the 100K, a Southeast Asian podium is on the cards in the women's race, with

Hau Ha Thi (VIE, UTMB Index 784) heading into race as the top-ranked, alongside Siok Har Lim (MAL, UTMB Index 584) and Angelie Cabalo (PHI, UTMB Index 630). In the men's race, Ji Duo (CHN, UTMB Index 888) heads into the race as the favorite while **Vlad Ixel** (AUS, <u>UTMB Index 832</u>) shifts his focus back to the longer distances. In the **50K** race, it is all to play for in the men's race with **Tao Luo** (CHN, UTMB Index 886), Tiago Viera (POR, UTMB Index 858), Gediminas Grinius (LIT,

UTMB Index 850) and Jisub Kim (KOR, UTMB Index 841) closely matched. In the women's race, the top-ranked and ones to watch include Sooji Park (KOR, UTMB Index 640) and Rashila Tamang (NEP, UTMB Index 615). The 20K race is sure to put the legs and lungs to the test, with Kana Antonio (PHI, UTMB Index 641) and Hiroyuki Kawachi (JPN, UTMB Index 706) predicted to set



Two-time top ten finisher at UTMB, Sabrina Stanley (USA, UTMB Index 705) is also a top favorite in the women's race. In the Kosci100 (100K), Abby Hall (USA, UTMB Index 750) and Katarzyna Solinska (POL, UTMB Index 748) head into the women's race as the top-ranked, while the men's race looks set to be an all-Australasia podium with Sam Harvey (NZL, UTMB Index 824), Benjamin Duffus (NZL, UTMB Index 818) and Vlad **Shatrov** (AUS, UTMB Index 801) the top contenders.

Madison Reynolds (AUS, UTMB Index 692) returns to try and defend her title in the women's race at Kosci50 (50K), but will face top-ranked Kimber Mattox (USA, UTMB Index 744). The second and third placed athletes from the 2022 -Blake Hose (AUS, UTMB Index 866) and Ronnie Sparke (GBR, UTMB Index 854) will be ready to battle it out at the top in the men's race. In a fast and furious 20K, two defending champions will go head-to-head. Patricia
