HOKA UTMB Mont-Blanc: Team Adaptive grows for a more inclusive trail experience

Following a powerful and widely celebrated debut in 2024, Team Adaptive returns to HOKA UTMB Mont-Blanc in 2025 with renewed energy and purpose. Building on the momentum and impact of its inaugural year, the initiative continues to champion a bold vision: to shift perceptions of disability in trail running — so it is seen not as something exceptional, but as integral to the sport.

This year Team Adaptive has grown to welcome **14 extraordinary athletes** from around the world, each with a unique story, background and relationship to disability or illness. United by their love for the trail and **a shared determination to break down prejudice**, these athletes will take on the various races of HOKA UTMB Mont-Blanc. More than a symbolic presence, together they **demonstrate that difference in no way diminishes determination, courage, or an ability to achieve the extraordinary**. Among them are returning athletes from the 2024 edition — back with even greater ambition and a fresh set of challenges to conquer.

"Our vision is simple: one day, we won't need to explain why Team Adaptive exists. One day, it won't be about inclusion - it will just be about sport. That day, our mission will be complete," said David Poletti, Head of operations and territory relations, HOKA UTMB Mont-Blanc, and Boris Ghirardi, Team Adaptive Manager.

Unique journeys, one collective adventure

Team Adaptive 2025 brings together athletes living with visible and invisible disabilities — they are united by their passion for pushing boundaries and their love of the trail.

- **ETC**: American **Dani Aravich**, a Paralympian born with agenesis an absence of the left forearm, returns to the trails with her characteristic grit and positivity.
- MCC: The Spanish duo Maria Petit a blind Catalan athlete who has climbed Kilimanjaro and Alberto Estrada, who lives with Parkinson's disease and discovered in trail running a powerful way to maintain mobility. They are joined by France's Paul Fontaine, who continues to defy cystic fibrosis through running.
- OCC: France's Claire Verzaux, born with agenesis of the right forearm;
 Franck Derrien, an ultra-trail runner with Asperger's; Guillaume Pick, a nature-loving athlete born deaf; Nicolas Ronget, a visually impaired physiotherapist from Lyon; and Spanish Paralympian Pol Makuri Redolad Garcia, born with hemiparesis, a weakness of one side of the body.
- <u>CCC</u>: French athletes **Julien Veysseyre**, a below-knee amputee and 2023 cross-triathlon world champion, and **Jonathan Naboulet**, a quadriplegic following a rugby accident, will be joined by South African **Travis Warwick-Oliver**, a below-knee amputee and founder of the organisation *Rejuvenate SA*.
- **UTMB**: France's **Fanny Barbara**, who overcame the complete removal of her left lung, will be joined by **Yanis Debaud**, a former rugby player now living with partial paralysis in his right foot due to nerve injury.

"Less talk, more action. We want to demonstrate that performance and passion have no boundaries," said Boris Ghirardi, Team Manager, also known affectionately as 'Robot Foot'.
