Slovakia's Michaela Lishakova and France's Paul Cornut Chauvnic claim victory in record time at the Nice Cote d'Azur by UTMB 100M

- Michaela Lishakova (SVK UTMB Index 660) and Paul Cornut Chauvinc (FRA - UTMB Index 879) take the top spot in the 100M Ultra-Trail Nice Côte d'Azur by UTMB® (Auron – Nice, 159km, 8,200m+).
- In the 50K race (ESP Nice, 55km, 2,147m+), Miguel Benitez (ESP UTMB Index 885) and Kim Schreiber (GER – UTMB Index 746) triumphed.
- Three races are currently still underway: the 100M (Auron Nice), the 100K (Roubion – Nice), and the 50K (Èze – Nice).
- One live broadcast covering all three races. • Tomorrow, Sunday 28 September, the 20K (Saint-Jean-Cap-Ferrat – Nice) will

100M RECORD SHATTERED BY NEARLY TWO HOURS **AND THIRTY MINUTES**



Paul Cornut Chauvinc produced a sensational performance in the 100M, finishing two hours ahead of schedule after increasing his lead throughout the night. The runner from Ardèche, now based in Foix, lived up to his favourite status, smashing the previous course record with a winning time of 18:52:37 – nearly two and a half hours ahead of Cristofer Clemente Mora's 2024 benchmark of 21:22:14.


The race, which began in Auron on Friday at 1pm, didn't start smoothly for Cornut

Chauvinc: "At the start, I even doubted whether I would finish. But after five hours everything clicked and the pain in my legs disappeared," he said at the finish line. Théo Le Boudec (FRA – UTMB Index 842) and Nicolas Thomas (BEL – UTMB Index 718) fought hard in a thrilling sprint finish to complete the men's podium, arriving in 19:52:12 and 19:52:18 respectively.

before being overtaken by Slovakia's Michaela Lishakova, who maintained her lead all the way to the finish in 25:16:07 – 32 minutes ahead of Case. Britain's Ellen Cheethan (UTMB Index 591) secured third place in 26:06:41. KIM SCHREIBER AND MIGUEL BENITEZ CLAIM **VICTORY IN THE 50K**

On Saturday morning, the 50K kicked off from Col d'Eze, offering runners a fastpaced start, with panoramic views over the Mediterranean and the Grande Corniche Regional Nature Park as a majestic backdrop. In the women's race, Germany secured the top two positions. Kim Schreiber took the

win in 05:16:27, ahead of her compatriot Vanessa Schätzle (UTMB Index 679) and France's Charlotte Mouchet (UTMB Index 671). In the men's field, the leaders battled hard, with Miguel Benitez emerging victorious in 04:28:44. Particularly strong on the rolling sections, the Spaniard pulled away

CELEBRATIONS AROUND THE RACES

For the past two days, the Promenade des Anglais has pulsed with the energy of the Nice Côte d'Azur by UTMB[®]. The festivities began on Thursday evening with a lively night relay, highlighted by the participation of a Team Joëlette, and continued Friday with races for young runners aged 7 to 17, whose enthusiasm and energy delighted the spectators. Throughout the weekend, the **Ultra-Trail Village** in Nice has been the beating

heart of the event. Closing on Sunday at 3pm, it has brought together bib collections, brand stands, race finishes, entertainment, and countless moments of community spirit shared between runners, volunteers, and supporters. Sunday promises further excitement with the start of the 20K at 7:30am, followed by the awards ceremonies for the 100M, 100K, and 20K. In the afternoon,

celebrations will focus on the Positive Fan Zone, where spectators are invited to cheer on the finishers with banners, messages of encouragement and a wave of green, the colour chosen to symbolise positive energy. The initiative is organised in partnership with Le Média Positif.
