POTENTIAL NEXT STEP

Jesus always spoke the truth in love. This week, let's follow His example. Whether on social media or in person, let's view and believe about others what God sees and knows. People are not our enemy. Let's choose to speak in love toward others as ambassadors of the kingdom.

MAIN POINTS & SCRIPTURES

We are called to live worthy of our calling. **(Ephesians 4:1; Romans 12:2)** Like Daniel, we must keep our hope in Jesus in the midst of Babylon (the world).

- Our citizenship is in heaven The moment that we are born again in Jesus, our citizenship changes from this world to the kingdom of heaven. When our Father is the King, we don't have to worry about bad middle management. (Philippians 3:20; 1 Peter 2:11; John 18:36; Acts 1:6,8; Matthew 6:33,4:17; Hebrews 11:13-16; 2 Corinthians 4:18; Psalm 90:12; Daniel 2:31-35,44; Habakkuk 2:14; Isaiah 9:7; Matthew 7:24-27; Luke 12:32)
- 2. We have been empowered to solve earthly problems with heavenly solutions Like Daniel, we are ambassadors who live to re-present the King and His kingdom. We are the church the people of God, united by the Spirit of God, under the Lordship of Jesus, sent to change the world. (2 Corinthians 5:20; Matthew 10:8,25:35-36; Luke 4:18-19; Matthew 16:19)
- 3. People are not our enemies Daniel understood that his oppressors weren't his enemies. We can't beat Babylon with Babylonian weapons; just like we will never defeat the world with hatred and division. People are not our enemies; they are our mission. (Ephesians 6:12; 2 Corinthians 10:3-4; Matthew 5:43-45)
- 4. The shaking makes us stronger Consumeristic Christianity is dying, and that's a good thing. "Christian" is not a box we check; it is a person we follow. "Christian" is not the nation we live in; it's the choice we make. (Daniel 6:19-23,28; Luke 10:19; 1 Peter 5:6; Psalm 56:11; Isaiah 4:1; Titus 1:16; 2 Timothy 3:5; Matthew 15:8; John 5:39-40; Romans 10:9; Mark 8:34-35; Matthew 4:19; Matthew 7:21-23; Revelation 3:15-16)
- 5. <u>Jesus is our Savior and Lord</u> The world says Jesus is a ticket to heaven; God says that Jesus is our Savior and Lord to bring us full life now. We need to confess (agree with God), repent (change our thinking), receive His Spirit, then be baptized. (Acts 2:38-41; Psalm 98:9)
