MAIN POINTS & SCRIPTURES

Following the cloud is living our lives with a willingness to change our plans to respond to what God is asking. (Proverbs 16:9) Often we hear God then we stop listening, instead of being in tune to what God is speaking in the moment. We build our lives on what God is saying, not on what He has said. (Matthew 4:4)

- 1. The Good Samaritan is a prophetic picture of Jesus. (Luke 10:30-37) We were broken, beat up and left to die when Jesus entered our lives. Jesus saw us, had compassion on us and went out of His way for us. He bound our wounds, healed us and paid for all the expenses we would ever have to pay. When we understand what Jesus did for us, we can go and do the same for others. We can't change the world if we don't love our neighbor. We put the love of God on display first where we are, then in our region and then to the world. (Acts 1:8)
- 2. Every day there is a storm with the magnitude of a hurricane, which rips through the souls and the lives of the people all around us. (Matthew 9:36-38) When crisis happens, it stirs within us an awakening to our purpose. We were made in the image and likeness of God and we are created to be on co-mission with Him; to serve, give, love and help people find life, hope and the goodness of God. (Genesis 1:28)
- 3. It's trendy to be involved in social justice because it makes us feel good about ourselves. However, it's Christ-like to put God's love on display. In Jesus, we become new creations and then we spend our lives doing significant things. (Ephesians 2:10) True love always leads people to the resurrected Christ. Jesus was always led by God's love and not motivated by human need. This caused Him to be peaceful, strategic and effective in every situation. Our motivation to help others will wear out, but the love of the Father never runs dry.
- 4. Who we are determines what we do. We are the light of the world who brings light to a dark world. We are the salt of the earth who brings taste to a flavorless world. We are the righteousness of God so we make wrong things right. We are set free in Christ so we can release the captives. We have been blessed so we become a blessing. The kingdom of God is within us which means our steps release heavenly life. (Luke 17:21) Once God delivers us, we become a deliverer; the Jesus in us is the answer to the world's cries.
- 5. We are the people of God, united by the spirit of God under the lordship of Jesus sent to change the world. We've been equipped to be part of the purposes of God beyond the crisis. (Genesis 50:20) Biblical salvation means to save, heal and make whole. We have an invitation for our hearts to become whole and live in the fullness of the gospel as we take a small step of compassion that will impact the people in the cities around us.
