BIG IDEA

We have to be faithful with the last thing if we want to discover the next thing.

KEY VERSE

"Be careful never to forget what you yourself have seen. Do not let these memories escape from your mind as long as you live! And be sure to pass them on to your children and grandchildren" (Deuteronomy 4:9).

SUMMARY

Pioneers are bold and courageous! They go beyond the horizon, they push the limits, they see what's beyond the bend, they go further and farther than those before them, they blaze new trails, they create the future. A pioneer is someone who moves into the unknown for the good of others and the glory of God. When we ask, listen, and respond by obediently taking next steps, we not only bless those who come behind us, but our lives are blessed as well (Luke 11:28). If we are going to have the courage to move forward, we need to look back at where God has been faithful in the past (Deuteronomy 4:9).

OUR STORY IS YOUR STORY

We are a family on mission and God is our guide (Psalm 119:105, Psalm 32:8). Whether this is your history or your inheritance, we all start today as equals.
