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Summary

Children, Youth and Community members in northern Kenya shall be empowered by accessing vital information, learning and reading materials. Information technology designed by African's for Kenyans will transform learning abilities in rural communities and improve equal access to quality education. The establishment of one eLearning Library in Lokichoggio town, and one Digital Classrooms at the Hannah-Emuriakin School can be a start to inclusion and active participation in the digital future of tomorrow.

Relevance

• Project Background

Lokichoggio, with its 35,000 people in the wider area, has no library or reading center. Even public schools lack any kind of extracurricular reading and study material. General literature (novels, biographies etc. and other course or study literature, except as per the Kenyan school curriculum) is not available in shops or at other local organization. Thousands of school youth often just loiter around without meaningful things to do when they are at home for school holidays.

• Goal and target Beneficiaries

Implementation of one **eLearning Library** with the Kio Kit "Digital Classroom" in the center of Loki and one resource at **Hannah-Emuriakin School** and which will add learning possibilities and help improve knowledge both of required curriculum and extracurricular material. It will also provide access to all sorts of classical literature. Installation of another Kio Kit "Digital Classroom"

Loki town eLearning Library – will be situated in the former International Red Cross Cafeteria, which is
securely fenced in and has adequate resources of day and night guards, access to the city grid and water. This
center is also situated in close proximity of several government and private primary schools with a total of
many thousand of students combined. The eLearning Library will also be provided with books – classical
literature, course literature and magazines.

• **Project Description**

Purchase and installation of two (2) Kio Kit, which is a box with a hardened, water-resistant, lockable case, containing 40 ruggedized Kio tablets, headphones and a BRCK (router-hard-disk) containing both world-class local and international content. There is a single plug to charge the Kit and one button to power on the entire system. The Kio Tablets and BRCK within it have enough battery to manage intermittent power in rural areas. Training of teachers and IT-crew both in soft- and hardware management. <u>http://education.brck.com</u>

Effectiveness

- **Technical approach –** 2 Staff with Secondary School and additional Computer Training will be trained to manage the systems for the e-Learning Library in Loki town.
- Teachers at Hannah-Emuriakin School will be trained to use the Kio Kit for students at the school.
- IT-Staff at Hannah-Emuriakin will be trained to provide support and upkeep of the systems both for the town e-Learning Library and the School
- **Stakeholder** Are all citizens, in particular youth and children who presently lack access to any kind of literature and other learning resources outside of their local school book material.

School children, teachers and community members will use the digital platform regularly for accessing reference material, exploring digital learning and enjoy playful discovery in a protected learning environment. The Kio Kit is providing offline digital media content adapted to local context. The information can be updated and extended on a regular basis. Offline content does not require connectivity and is avoiding internet distractions and risks so the readers can focus on life enriching learning content. The Kio Kit community library will stifle curiosity, enhance literacy and provide active learning opportunities for All. The library will broaden their horizon and enable them to connect to local, national and global knowledge. A transformation in learning skills is expected and a zeal for further community development aspired.

Sustainability and Transition

- Local Participation LEDO (Lokichoggio Emuriakin Development Organization) has since its inception in 2009 (registered as a Community Based Organization with the Kenyan Ministry of Gender and Social Services in 2011) been the implementer of the Hannah-Emuriakin ECD and Primary School with its 510 children, a extensive and effective Latrine Project for the community and other institutions (more then 150 installed), the support of more than 50 Secondary and University students, implementation of a Water Project, Farming, Sewing Project and a Computer Training Center. LEDO will be owner and caretaker of both the Loki town eLearning Library and the Hannah-Emuriakin Digital Classroom.
- Empowerment and transition plan Long term sustainability will ascertained both through the technical support available from BRCK, the Kenyan company, developer and provider of the Kio Kit and the ongoing training and long term support of the local library staff both at the town eLearning Center and the HE Digital Classroom.
