This year has seen Wales Millennium Centre emerge confidently from the challenges presented by the Covid pandemic thanks to the ongoing support of our partners, members, donors, trusts, foundations and the public.

Our new Cabaret venue now shares the best of drag, cabaret, comedy, burlesque and more, and our new digital venue Bocs (one of a kind in UK arts centres) offers free, groundbreaking immersive experiences. We also continue to develop accessible and inspiring spaces for communities to gather and create in the heart of our building.

Community-led celebrations from St David's Day to Diwali have breathed life back into our building following the pandemic and we've expanded our Croeso 'pay what you can' tickets to communities across Wales.

In addition to hosting leading international shows, we continue to produce our own work, showcasing Welsh creativity to over 40,500 people worldwide. This has included a run at the National Theatre in London for The Boy with Two Hearts. As part of this work, we've continued to support artists with rehearsal space,

guidance and industry connections and our creative associates have enriched our work for a second year.

As ever, Wales' future generations remain a priority and we're working to establish permanent youth-led Maker Spaces to nurture their creativity and grow our unique programme of free skills development training, alongside our industry partners.

As a charity that receives only 15% of our income from public funding, this work is only possible with the support of our audiences, funders, partners, visitors and volunteers. RAISING ASPIRATIONS OF YOUNG PEOPLE

We produce joyful, life-enhancing creative learning opportunities and experiences with and for our nation's young people. We support them to build creative confidence and expand their skills, social networks and career pathways. This year over 6,500 young people have been inspired here at Wales Millennium Centre and across our partner venues in Wales.

170+ **Creative Voice** graduates received 12 hours of free in-depth training in radio, music and visual and digital arts. I have found members of senior management to be not only interested in our perspective but also eager to actually fight for our voices to be heard.

Supporting Wales-based artists to develop and showcase innovative Welsh work, we've brought eight Wales Millennium Centre productions, co-productions and experiences to 40,500+ audience members, and we're working on another six, including our Welsh language main stage epic musical, Branwen: Dadeni, co-produced with Frân Wen.



- Opportunities for 10,000+ community members to participate in our upcoming co-curated experiences, installations and celebrations, spanning Eid, Carnival and Diwali.
- The arrival of our first Welsh language main stage epic musical Branwen: Dadeni, co-produced with Frân Wen.
- The return of our international arts festival Llais with our most epic line-up yet.
- The expansion of our programme of courses for young people offering more creative opportunities and experiences.



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EXPANDING OUR SPACES

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In 2022/23 we saw the opening of our new Cabaret space, our digital venue Bocs and our new café-bar Ffwrnais. Next year we will complete this ambitious phase of transformations marking a warmer welcome to Wales Millennium Centre, with our refurbished members' bar Copr.

Next, we're creating permanent youth-led Platfform spaces, enabling 10,000+ young people and creatives to co-develop and access our programmes. They will include recording studios, digital labs, rehearsal, performance areas, a new radio station and a maker's workshop.

Looking further ahead, we are planning for the Cardiff Bay Production and Skills Hub, which will offer more rehearsal and production space and industry training to Wales' creatives, and reinforce our reputation as a world-class cultural district.
