Student Achievement Conferences

Please remember that appointments need to be made by **5.00 pm tomorrow, Tuesday 6 August**, for the Student Achievement Conferences on **Wednesday, 7 August and Thursday, 8 August**. Students will finish classes at the end of Period 4 on Wednesday and Thursday. The school library will still be open until 4.30 pm as normal and school buses will run at their normal after-school times. Live Reporting

Live reporting provides feedback on student achievement throughout the year. All live reports (as well as other relevant student/parent information) can be accessed through the KAMAR Parent Portal. Parents are also welcome to use the iPad in the Student Centre when visiting the school; print-outs can also be requested, if required.

Whanganui High School Representatives Policy

Upon enrolling at Whanganui High School, all students and parents sign our Representatives Policy. One of the key points of this policy is that students are expected to have **at least 90% attendance at school** before they can represent Whanganui High School in any co-curricular activity (justifiable or explained absences are taken into fair consideration when looking at the overall percentage figure).

There is considerable research showing a strong correlation between student attendance and NCEA achievement. Please note that if your son or daughter's attendance is below 90% then he or she will not be able to represent Whanganui High School in co-curricular activities. It makes little sense for a student who is not attending school regularly to then be representing the school externally in co-curricular activities.

Traffic Safety

We recently had a minor traffic accident after school on Purnell Street, involving two of our students in a car, and an adult driver in another car travelling to Wellington. Please support us by encouraging your children of driving age to drive responsibly at all times – only students with a full licence can take passengers in their cars; or if they are a learner driver they need to have someone with a full licence present in the car.
