EXTERNAL COURSES

This year 138 Senior students have been enrolled in Tertiary Education. 106 students have participated in various U-Skills courses and 32 have been involved with either AG Challenge, Training For You or Achievement NZ. Students attend either a one or two day placement and are gaining gualifications towards their NCEA Certificate in their chosen career, for example, Hairdressing, Vet Nursing, Paint and Panel, Mechatronics, Farming, Makeup and Skincare.

Applications are now open for UCOL's U-Skills courses for 2020. These courses are either at Level 2 or 3 and there are approximately 22 different courses available to any student in Years 11-13. Applications close at the end of the school year.

WORK EXPERIENCE

From dog grooming to electrical work, welding to waitressing, childcare centre to automotive workshop, veterinarian surgery to Bushy Park Reserve ... and many other activities and work places our students are out there, representing Whanganui High School and gaining valuable skills in the work place.

This year we have over ninety students out gaining work place skills at least one day a week, working in a wide variety of industries. About two thirds of these students belong to our Gateway programme, but many do not.
