Sanda is a combat sport originally developed by the Chinese military. It is a combination of full-contact kickboxing and wrestling.

Grappling

Competitive grappling is similar to submission wrestling and draws on techniques from many martial art systems such as Chi-na, Ju-jitsu, and Judo.

We started 2020 with a small group of students carrying on from the previous year looking to compete in either a stand up or grappling tournament. So, we focused on working towards conditioning for a stand-up competition (kickboxing).

We also had our “mini-ninja’s” (under 13’s) group training in fitness and traditional Kung Fu basic techniques, giving the senior students in the group an opportunity to lead and support their younger team members.

We farewelled two of our “mini-ninjas” this year, Elizabeth and Henry Smith, who have moved to Dubai. These were two amazing young students - Henry graded for his first level showing energy and resilience, and Elizabeth, who was promoted to her second level for displaying great discipline and dedication. I’m sure these two will do great things in whatever they may do in the future.

Lockdown put a few things on hold for the group this year. Three of the tournaments I had lined up for our fighters were cancelled, and training routines had to be adapted so the training could be done individually at home. Angus and Zane teamed up together in the K2 Under 16 races and won easily in both the K2 200m and 500m races. They also had successful K4 races when joining up with other clubs. Because of Zane's outstanding results in the Under 16 events, he was selected to represent New Zealand at the Asia Pacific Championships that were to be held in Japan.

Sadly due to Covid-19, this event was cancelled. Over the winter, Zane and Angus have competed at various events around New Zealand as part of the 2020 Kayak Krazy series, both competing in the Under 16 category and both getting 3rd third equal over the entire competition. The three paddlers will all be competing at the upcoming events this year in Rotorua, Blue Lakes 1 in October and Blue Lakes 2 in December, where they will be hoping to be gaining very similar results.
