Te Whatu Ora Health New Zealand

Jo Anni, Hannah and Kelli-Ann are the public health nurses working in Whanganui High School. The Ministry of Health has provided funding to help identify and address the health needs of students. One way that your child's health needs are assessed is by the nurse completing a health check and this is offered to all Year 9 students. Parents/Caregivers of all Year 9 students will receive a letter in the mail shortly explaining this health review.

The nurses also run a nurse clinic every Monday, Wednesday and Friday, from 9.00 am until 2.00 pm. Appointments can be booked at the Student Centre. All appointments are private and confidential.
