Mobile phones 'Away for the day' rules

The Government has recently introduced regulations requiring all students to put mobile phones 'away for the day' during normal school days.

For nearly the last two years we have had very similar rules in place regarding mobile phones and airpods (or similar) not being allowed to be used during subject class time – we also successfully trialled this during Form Time with our Junior students at the end of 2023.

The new Government regulations also require mobile phones to be 'put away' during student <u>Break Times</u>, i.e. our First and Second Break of each school day.

As a result, from <u>today onwards</u> students have been asked to put any mobile phones into their bags during Break Times, as well as during Form Time and subject classes. The response from students has been overwhelmingly positive.

The request will be made politely by staff members, and all students are expected to follow this instruction. The staff member will then move on to continue with his or her own Break Time or active supervision duty. As is our normal practice, House Deans and Senior Leadership Team members will follow up with any non-compliance.

Parents may wish to seriously consider asking their children to leave their mobile phones at home before coming to school. A few teachers may ask students to bring phones to school from time-to-time as part of a valid assessment process, but parents/caregivers will receive advance notice of this request from the subject teacher.

Vaping

I always take a firm line on vaping at school or at any school-associated activity. Students who vape are formally stood down from school for two days and must attend a re-entry meeting back into school in the Principal's office with me, adult family members, and the student's House Dean and/or House Deputy Principal. The students also receive literature on the harmful effects of vaping on the growing teenage body and need to complete a question/answer activity on the effects of vaping.

Form Time

Your son or daughter's House Form Teacher is an extremely significant figure in the education of your child. I have asked all Form Teachers to make email contact with the parents and caregivers of all students in their Form Classes <u>before</u> Friday, 9 February. Please let me know if you have not heard from your son or daughter's House Form Teacher and I will personally follow-up with the relevant teacher.

School will be closed on Monday, 5 February

Please note that we will <u>not</u> be open for instruction on Monday, 5 February due to the Waitangi Day Public Holiday on Tuesday, 6 February. Many student families will be going away for an extended weekend – and we have added one more teaching day onto our end-of-year last day of school.
