As we head towards the end of Term 1, I would like to briefly go over a few important matters.

## Student Achievement Conferences

Our Conferences run from 3.00 pm to 8.40 pm on Tuesday, 9 April and Wednesday, 10 April in the Te Mana and Te Wehi gymnasiums. We welcome all students and parents to discuss academic progress with subject teachers over both evenings. Bookings for the Conferences close at 5.00 pm on Monday, 8 April.

Please note that students will finish their school day at 2.00 pm on both Tuesday and Wednesday. Our buses will run at their normal scheduled times and our Library will continue to be open until the normal 4.30 pm closing time on both days.

## Uniform & Personal Presentation

Generally, the overwhelming majority of our students meet our Uniform Set 1, Set 2 or Set 3 and Personal Presentation expectations perfectly well. With the imminent arrival of the winter months, this is a further reminder that non-uniform items worn at school are confiscated by staff members and need to be collected by students from the Deans' House after school on Friday afternoons. Non-uniform items must be kept at home.

Please note that our new Green Crew Neck Sweater is now in stock at Andersons Uniforms (184 Victoria Avenue, Whanganui; 06 348 9232) for a cost of just \$55.00 – this will be a useful alternative to our Green Woollen Jersey for a good number of students.

I am also pleased to let you know that Andersons Uniforms have been able to recently reduce the cost of the Tartan Skirt by a further \$10 for this year and into the 2025 school year.

## Attendance at School

As we all know, regular attendance at school is extremely important for life-long learning, general well-being, the establishment of positive daily routines and habits, higher levels of educational achievement, better future job stability and, ultimately, more active and constructive participation in our community.

You may also be interested to know that if students miss one day of school every two weeks from the time they begin primary school until they turn 16 years of age, they will have missed one whole year of schooling and education by their 16<sup>th</sup> birthday.

## School Nurses

JoAnni, Kelli-Ann, Anna and Chrystal are the Public Health Nurses supporting Whanganui High School this year. The Ministry of Health has provided funding to identify and address the health needs of students. One way that your child's health needs are assessed is by the nurse completing a health check and this is offered to all Year 9 students. Parents will receive a letter in the mail explaining this service.

We also have a nurse clinic every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday 9am until 2pm. Students can make an appointment with the Student Centre. All appointments are private and confidential.
