## Common Assessment Activities Literacy and Numeracy testing (Monday, 27 May to Wednesday, 29 May)

Over 300 of our Year 10, Year 11 and a few Year 12 students are entered into the May round of the CAA Literacy and Numeracy testing. All the students involved know <u>which</u> assessments they are sitting and <u>when</u>, and <u>where</u> they are sitting these very important assessments.

Please note that due to the huge timetabling complications – over 300 students across three year levels sitting assessments at set times while normal timetabled classes are still running – our timetable structure for <u>Monday 27 May to Wednesday</u> <u>29 May</u> will be slightly different for those <u>three days</u> only.

Form Time will be at 8.50 am to 9.00 am, Period 1 will be 9.00 am to 10.00 am; Period 2 will be 10.00 am to 11.00 am; First Break will be 11.00 am to 11.30 am, Period 3 will be 11.30 am to 12.30 pm; Second Break will be 12.30 pm to 1.00 pm; Period 4 will be 1.00 pm to 2.00 pm; Period 5 will be 2.00 pm to 3.00 pm.

## **Children's Spectacle Subsidy**

A child or young person who is 15 years of age or under <u>AND</u> is a holder of a valid High Health User Card <u>OR</u> the family holds a current Community Services Card can apply for a subsidy level of \$287.50 each year until they turn 16 years old through Enable New Zealand. The subsidy is claimed through Optometrists and Ophthalmologists registered with Enable New Zealand.
