Warmest greetings to everybody as we head towards the beginning of the 2025 school year.

Following on from the email I sent to all whānau on 19 December, this Newsletter outlines important information for the first few days of Term 1.

MONDAY, 27 January – Year 9 and Year 13 at school as well as new students across other Year levels. Our Pōwhiri will begin at 9.00 am. Please arrive between 8.30 am and 8.50 am. We ask that all WHĀNAU and STUDENTS remain behind the gate on Purnell Street with their bags. Students will be split into female and male lines along Purnell Street – you will be guided by Whanganui High School Kaiako/staff members. Please note that our pōwhiri always welcomes well over 400 students and whānau – organisation and patience is always key to success.

To end our powhiri we invite all whanau to our A1 Te Reo Maori classroom for kai and refreshments. Students will have different kai arrangements in place from our school canteen.

10.30 am – students will be organised into Houses and then into Form classes. The rest of the day will involve a range of House group activities for students and staff.

TUESDAY, 28 January – Years 9, 12, and 13 at school

8.50 am – **9.50** am – **Form Class** for **Years 9** and **13**. Timetables issued and more orientation experience for Year 9 students.

Year 12 students go to the Hall with teachers of Year 12 subjects for Period 1, Tuesday. Normal timetabled subject classes for the rest of the day.

WEDNESDAY 29 January – Years 9, 11, 12 and 13 at school

8.50 am - 9.50 am - Period 1 timetabled classes for Years 9, 12 and 13.

Year 11 students go to the Hall with teachers of Year 11 subjects for Period 1, Wednesday.

9.50 am - 10.05 am - Form Time - normal timetabled classes for the rest of the day.

THURSDAY 30 January – Years 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13 at school – ALL STUDENTS at school.

8.50 am – 9.50 am – Period 1 timetabled classes for Years 9, 11, 12 and 13.

Year 10 students go to the Hall with teachers of Year 10 subjects for Period 1, Thursday.

9.50 am - 10.05 am - Form Time - Normal timetabled classes for the rest of the day.

FRIDAY 31 January - NORMAL TIMETABLED CLASSES ALL DAY

Mobile Phones
