SchoolDocs Policies and Procedures

Over the last few months we have been transitioning over to SchoolDocs. Our SchoolDocs site contains policies and procedures that are specific to Whanganui High School and can be accessed by our whole school community (a 'Quick Guide to SchoolDocs for the School Community' information sheet is attached to this email).

<u>Traffic Safety on Purnell Street during peak traffic flow times</u>

Over the last few years I have spoken to and met multiple people with relevant levels of responsibility at the Whanganui District Council on the urgent need for significantly better traffic safety on the heavily congested Purnell Street during peak traffic flow times — including my submission of a written and in-person submission to the Whanganui District Council Strategy and Policy Committee on 10 April 2024 regarding proposed speed limit changes.

Many possibilities and suggestions have been made by the relevant people – but nothing has yet changed to make the traffic situation safer for our students, whānau, staff and our wider community, and this is increasingly concerning as our school roll keeps growing.

I continue to review what we can do to make the traffic situation as safe as possible for our community. Please note the following:

From this afternoon the two gates into our main staff carpark will be locked 20 minutes before the final school bell for the day and up to 15 minutes after the final school bell (many parents have been driving into the main staff car park to pick up children and then causing increased congestion when driving back out onto Purnell Street);

Please do not park in the bus bay area at any time when buses are arriving or departing school;

To avoid traffic congestion on Purnell Street, I strongly recommend that parents collecting their children after school park in the Jubilee Stadium car park. Our students have easy access to Jubilee Stadium by walking along our covered walkway and crossing London Street.

We have asked police officers to monitor the peak traffic flow times on Purnell Street for road safety and the safety of our students. Some are drivers stopping on yellow lines to pick up students or pull out directly in front of students as students try to cross to the other side of Purnell Street.
