Kia ora koutou

I extend a very warm greeting and welcome to everybody for the 2026 school year and hope that you have had an enjoyable and restful time with family and friends over the Christmas and New Year period.

Newsletter 1 contains very important information about the first few days of Term 1 as well as essential details about structural changes this year. Please read all details carefully.

MONDAY 26 JANUARY – Year 9 and Year 13 at school as well as new students across all other Year levels. Our pōwhiri will begin promptly at **9.00 am**. Please arrive between **8.30 am and 8.50 am**. We ask that all **WHĀNAU** and **STUDENTS** remain behind the gate on Purnell Street with their bags. Students will be organised into female and male lines along the Purnell Street footpath. You will be guided by Whanganui High School staff members and senior students.

At the conclusion of our pōwhiri, we invite all whānau to our A1 Te Reo Māori classroom for refreshments, kai and conversation. Students will have kai arrangements in place from our school canteen.

10.15 am (approximately) – **Year 9 and other new students** will go back to the Hall for organisation into form classes. The rest of the day will involve lunch, activities in House groups, and then a student, staff, and whānau sausage sizzle towards the end of the school day. Year 13 students will have their normal Period 4 and Period 5 classes.

TUESDAY 27 JANUARY – Years 9, 12, and 13 at school

8.55 am to 9.20 am – Form class time for Years 9 and 13. Timetables issued and more orientation experience for Year 9 students – Year 12 students go to the Hall.

Normal timetabled classes for the rest of the day.

WEDNESDAY 28 JANUARY – Years 9, 11, 12, and 13 at school

8.55 am to 9.10 am – Form class time for Years 9, 12, and 13 – Year 11 students go to the Hall.

Normal timetabled classes for the rest of the day.

THURSDAY 29 JANUARY – Years 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13 at school (ALL STUDENTS ARE AT SCHOOL)

8.55 am to 9.10 am – Form class time for Years 9, 11, 12, and 13 – Year 10 students go to the Hall.

Normal timetabled classes for the rest of the day.

TIMETABLE STRUCTURE AND BELL TIMES

This year we have moved to a two-week WEEK A and WEEK B timetable structure. This means that nearly every student will now study seven different subjects for a total of seven hours for each subject over the two-week time period.

The most important details to note are that: students need to arrive at school no later than 8.45 am every day (unless they have Year 13 Period 1 study time) and that the First Bell for Form Time will ring at 8.50 am; timetabled school will now finish for students at 3.00 pm every day (apart from on **Wednesday Week B only** when timetabled school for students will finish at 2.00 pm).
