Edmonton, AB – The Edmonton Symphony Orchestra (ESO) announced its 2018/2019 concert season this week, including a week-long celebration of beloved Finnish composer Jean Sibelius.

"I'm thrilled with our upcoming season, particularly the opportunity to share many works by one of the world's most performed composers," says Alexander Prior, the ESO's Chief Conductor. "Festival patrons will have the chance to intimately get to know Sibelius' world and to delve into his magical and mysterious imagination," adds Prior.

From Beethoven to Star Trek, the 2018-2019 season will amplify Edmonton's arts and culture scene. With some of the most unique and varied musical performances in the world, the ESO continues to offer exhilarating concerts with renowned guest artists and an engaging program as diverse as its audience.

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About Alex Prior:

Alexander Prior is the Chief Conductor Designate for the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra. A few words scarcely suffice to describe London-born Prior, who at 18 conducted the Dallas Symphony in the premiere of his *Sixth Symphony*, whose ballet *Mowgli* has been playing in Moscow for seven years, and who at 17 was the youngest student since Sergei Prokofiev to graduate with distinction as a conductor from the Conservatoire in St. Petersburg. In March 2013 Mr. Prior conducted five performances of the opera *Carmen* at the Royal Opera House in Copenhagen. This was followed on November 2 by the premiere of *La Traviata* at the Leipzig Opera and in spring 2014 the premiere of the opera *Mirandolina* by Bohuslav Martinů in a Bavarian State Opera production at Munich's Cuvillé Theatre.

About the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra

In its 66th year, the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra has taken its place as one of Canada's foremost orchestral ensembles. Its current roster includes 56 musicians from Canada and around the world performing a wide-ranging repertoire from the great classical masterworks to pops and family concerts. The orchestra is the resident artistic ensemble, the "home team," of the Francis Winspear Centre for Music, among the best acoustic concert halls in North America.

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
