## Bike to the Symphony

**Edmonton, AB (May 1, 2023)** – Calling all cyclists! Bike to the Symphony returns as cyclists are invited to ride together through some of Edmonton's most scenic streets before enjoying an Edmonton Symphony Orchestra (ESO) concert at the Winspear Centre on May 19th. The event is a collaboration between The ESO, Winspear Centre, and Paths For People and Bike Edmonton.

This year's route will take participants along Whyte Avenue, across the High-Level Bridge, and through Edmonton's Arts District to the Winspear's doors. The ESO will host the evening's New Music Series performance of Dark Patterns. This concert celebrates living composers, ESO premiere works, and guest artist debuts including Juno Award-winning composer Samy Moussa, who will conduct the ESO for this concert. The series blends the familiar with the cutting-edge for an hour-long performance at the Winspear Centre. Audiences are invited to enjoy music, mingling, and a contemporary side of the ESO and take advantage of a special ticket offer. A monitored, secure bike parking area will be available for cyclists.

"To share our love for music and help turn a bike ride into an inspiring moment is exciting," says James Schutz, Winspear Centre and ESO Director of Marketing and Business Development. "Biking has always been a part of the ESO culture, and this event is a wonderful opportunity to raise awareness of how many people commute by bike. Finishing the day with a concert, in an acoustically splendid setting, is a great way to start your weekend."

"When we started this event in 2010, we had around 100 people, including musicians, riding to the symphony, looking great and having so much fun. Cycling in Edmonton has grown tremendously since then, and it's easier than ever to ride," adds Christopher Chan, Paths for People board member.
