Job Summary:

The Head of Lighting reports to the Director of Operations. The role is responsible for lighting for all shows and concerts at the Winspear Centre, scheduling the department and roster crew hours, budgets, administrative duties, time sheets, client meetings, inventory and maintenance of equipment, training of roster crew, and running concerts and events.

This position adheres to the Collective Agreement between the Winspear Centre and the IATSE Local Union No. 210.

Key Responsibilities:

- Load in and out of clients, set up and tear down, and take care of all requirements within their designated jurisdiction, which is facilitated and supervised by their department
- Facilitate project lighting and or special effect requirements
- Control lighting department activity during concerts and events
- Maintain all dimmers, lighting instruments, and control boards
- Troubleshoot as much as possible and then source out gear to be repaired
- Operate console for events and have an artistic ability to suit all events
- Forecast and maintain the lighting budget
- Accurate input of all department hours to Sharepoint bi-weekly
- Project power distribution
- Maintain all electrical distro panels associated with production in the venue, power supply cables, all follow spots and booth area
- Tying in of show power and bus shore power when required; vast majority of tie-ins are cam lock as opposed to tails-into-panel; being a certified electrician is not required
- Facilitate necessary annual department equipment inspections and maintenance
- Manage department inventory and order replacement supplies, project-based supplies, and equipment as required
- Train, supervise, and schedule casual lighting staff, and review staff time sheets
- Liaise with client personnel on event days
- Keep project records
- Research and plan department capital improvements
- Work closely with the design team on the Winspear Project to decide which equipment to purchase and install and the full setup of the new space.
- Research industry developments and professional development opportunities
- Maintain a clean control area and storage area
- Other duties as reasonably requested by the Supervisor
