- In fall 2025, we opened the first sections of the Winspear Expansion, including a new classroom and two studios, space for performances, recitals and education through YONA, the Conservatory and all our Tommy Banks Centre programs.
- In February 2026, we opened a new YONA site at the Ivor Dent school in the northeast Edmonton neighbourhood of Rundle Heights, the only site in an Edmonton Public School, giving more children the opportunity to benefit from YONA's holistic care.

A Lifetime of Giving: Arnold and Grace Rumbold in Edmonton's Arts Community



Arnold and Grace Rumbold have been beloved fixtures in Edmonton's arts scene for decades, known for their warmth, humour and unwavering support of music in the community. If you attended an Edmonton Symphony Orchestra (ESO) concert at the Jubilee in the 1960s, you likely saw the Rumbolds in the audience. (Just don't greet them with "Hey guys" — Grace would quip, "I'm not a guy!", her gentle way of reminding you of her grace and individuality.)

The Rumbolds' journey began at a college dance in Calgary in 1953, where Arnold, a smooth-talking electrician-in-training, met Grace, a stenography student. It was, by all accounts, love at first sight. The young couple married in 1957 and moved to Edmonton the next year, planting roots in a city that would soon benefit immensely from their presence.

Arnold came from humble beginnings — he grew up on a farm with no electricity and built his first wind-powered light as a teen — but Edmonton offered something his hometown

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couldn't: a vibrant arts community. Arnold even joined the Richard Eaton Singers and later the Edmonton Opera Chorus, turning his new-found passion into participation. As he once mused, "What would Edmonton be without a symphony?" — the ESO was one reason the Rumbolds never looked back after settling here.

Over the decades, Arnold and Grace transformed their love of the arts into a profound philanthropic legacy. Arnold built a successful career in Edmonton's electrical industry, rising to chief estimator and "hanging out his own shingle" by launching an electrical consulting firm in 1988. Arnold and Grace's business success gave them the means to give back in a big way. They became generous benefactors to the very institutions they loved as audience members.

On September 12, 1997, Arnold proudly stepped onto the Winspear Centre stage as a chorister during the concert hall's opening night, singing alongside the ESO and Calgary Philharmonic. This was a moment that symbolized the couple's full circle from concertgoers to part of the performance. In 2019, when the Winspear Centre announced its ambitious expansion project, the Rumbolds were among the first to pledge support. Having watched Edmonton grow from a city of 250,000 in 1958 to over one million today, Arnold and Grace knew that a world-class music facility would be vital for future generations. In gratitude for their visionary support, the Winspear Centre has recently named its choir loft the "Arnold and



Grace Rumbold Choir Loft," a permanent tribute to the couple, which was unveiled in 2025.

In 2022, Grace and Arnold partnered with Edmonton Opera to create the Rumbold Vocal Prize, a nationwide competition for emerging Canadian opera singers. This annual prize not only provides financial awards but also mentorship and networking opportunities for young vocalists. Grace found joy at the Vocal Prize events: she was a familiar, welcoming presence, cheering on performers and congratulating them as they came off stage.

Grace passed away on October 8, 2024, but her

and Arnold's impact on Edmonton's cultural life endures. Their contributions have been recognized widely and their legacy lives on in the institutions and people they continue to uplift. The ESO performs in a hall they helped build, young opera singers' voices soar thanks to their prize, and students pursue careers they love thanks to their scholarships. "We've had a pretty darn good life ... in the best of countries. We are so fortunate," Arnold reflects gratefully. In turn, Edmonton feels fortunate to have had champions like Grace and Arnold Rumbold, a couple whose love for each other, for music and for their community will resonate for generations to come.

Building the Community: Mark and Nancy Heule's Long-term Giving

Mark and Nancy Heule, long-time subscribers and donors, were both exposed to music at a young age. Nancy remembers cèlidhs on Saturday nights in her childhood home. She started playing the piano at age eight and still enjoys doing so. Mark's father, a great lover of music, was on the ESO board many years ago and his love of fine music was passed on to his children.

When describing the importance of their long-time philanthropic support, the Heules say, "Music has been integral to our lives as



individuals, as a couple and as a community. We have made many friends in the music world. As well, our association with the ESO has led to philanthropy and all the benefits that has provided to us: a predominately better and more livable community in which to reside and work."

Long-time donors like the Heules are crucial to vibrant communities. Their commitment to the Winspear and ESO means that music here in Edmonton has consistent support and a healthy financial future. "We would encourage others to enjoy wonderful experiences such as Symphony under the Sky complete with picnics in the park, and, at one time, fireworks, as well as a beer tent," said the Heules. "Every year we look forward to an exciting season of many concerts, including the Messiah at Christmas, all with astounding players, conductors and composers."

Uplifting the Community: Drs. Megan and Georg Schmölzer's Sustained Giving

Drs. Megan and Georg Schmölzer are passionate supporters of youth and music in Edmonton. As monthly donors to the Youth Orchestra of Northern Alberta (YONA), they make sure children have access to free, holistic music education every day after school.

Their connection to music runs deep. Georg grew up in Austria, spending much of his youth in Graz and Vienna, cities deeply connected with classical music. Vienna in particular played a formative role in his appreciation of music. Megan grew up in Melbourne, Australia, a city with a rich cultural and educational environment, which shaped her deep appreciation for the arts and for the role of education in empowering young people.

Megan and Georg came to Edmonton to pursue research that improves the lives of premature

babies. Megan, a scientist, and Georg, a neonatologist and clinician-scientist, loved the opportunity to advance neonatal care and to make a real difference in families' lives. Their dedication to helping others extends beyond their professional work and into their support for youth and the arts.

They were first introduced to YONA at a dinner hosted by one of Georg's colleagues. That evening sparked their interest in the program. "We were deeply moved by the passion and dedication behind the program," they recall. What followed was a commitment to support YONA's mission — not just once, but every month.

Becoming monthly donors reflects a thoughtful approach to giving. "We believe in providing consistent support that helps YONA plan ahead and continue its important mission," they explain. "By contributing regularly, we know we

Leaving a Legacy: Larry Anderson's Powerful Philanthropy



Larry Anderson didn't just live in Edmonton, he helped shape it. A visionary entrepreneur turned philanthropist, Larry dedicated his life to lifting others up and ensuring young people had every opportunity to thrive. From building homes for Alberta families to nurturing the next generation of citizens, his impact on the city's landscape and heart will be felt for decades.

Larry found his passion in business, rising from a copier salesman to launching Growth Marketing in 1974 and co-founding Lincolnberg Homes in 1978. By 1985, he and his partners formed the ManCap Group, which would go on to build over 8,000 homes for Alberta families. He was also an involved speaker becoming a Distinguished Toastmaster. Larry's business career was defined by hard work and an entrepreneurial spirit.

One of Larry's greatest interests was music and he firmly believed in its power to change lives. In 2013, he became a founder of the Youth Orchestra of Northern Alberta (YONA), a free program that gives kids structure, joy and a sense of belonging. YONA goes much

further than fostering musicians, it builds young people into wonderful neighbours and community members. Thanks in no small part to Larry and his wife Janet's support, YONA has flourished: in 2025 it engaged nearly 300 students from diverse backgrounds with an astounding 91 per cent attendance rate — far above typical after-school programs. Each success story from YONA reflects Larry's vision and his unwavering belief in the potential of young people.

Larry's devotion to music and community went beyond YONA's daily programs. He was also a key champion of the Winspear Centre's Expansion project, recognizing it as an investment in Edmonton's cultural future. Larry worked throughout his life to bring Edmonton together and build a better community.

Edmonton's arts and youth communities today stand as a living tribute to Larry's generosity and vision. His legacy plays on in each young musician's first note at the Winspear Centre and in every act of leadership and kindness those individuals pay forward. He will be remembered for his generosity and as someone who lifted up everyone around him.



Trailblazer: Elexis Schloss Led with Generosity

Elexis Schloss was a visionary philanthropist, artist and community leader whose generosity and creativity transformed lives across Edmonton and beyond. Born in Medicine Hat and raised in Calgary, she studied architecture at McGill and served as Chief of Design at Maclab Enterprises.

Elexis supported over 25 organizations and welcomed thousands of new Canadians as a citizenship judge. Her thoughtfulness and philanthropic spirit, including knitting scarves and distributing gift cards to the unhoused community, guided her life.

At the Winspear Centre, Elexis was a passionate supporter and founder of the Youth Orchestra of Northern Alberta (YONA) which provides free, intensive music education and holistic care to children in central Edmonton and on Alexander First Nation. Students attend five days a week, receiving music instruction, academic support, nutritious snacks and social development programming, all at no cost to the families. Her support helped YONA grow into a transformative force in Edmonton, helping students build musical skill, confidence and community pride. To honour her vision and commitment to helping children reach their potential, the YONA Class of 2025 will be named for Elexis Schloss.

Through MacEwan University, Elexis endowed Indigenous student support.

To honour her efforts for the Indigenous community, she was named an Honorary Elder by the Aboriginal Women's Professional Association in 2008. She was also awarded an honorary degree from MacEwan for her support and leadership.

Elexis founded many projects and organizations. She co-founded Compassion House for breast cancer patients and developed a chocolate truffle served in first-class on Air Canada flights. The Queen Mother even ordered some to bring back home to her daughter, the Queen. On top of all this, Elexis created and designed sweaters worn by Princess Diana and Victoria Principal, star of *Dallas*, among others.

Elexis also contributed to the Art Gallery of Alberta, Edmonton's Jewish community and volunteered in Ghana, Ethiopia (twice), Rwanda (twice), Kenya, and Haiti (twice) after the earthquake in 2010. Her trips inspired her to create a comic book on HIV, which encouraged children to support their mothers getting tested to prevent future birth infections. This comic book was circulated in Africa and India.

Her many honours include the Queen's Jubilee Medal, the Rotary Integrity Award and induction into the Order of Canada. Her legacy of compassion, creativity and community lives on through all her small and large acts of kindness.

To honour her vision and commitment to helping children reach their potential, the YONA Class of 2025 will be named for Elexis Schloss.

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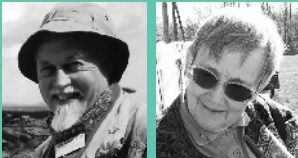
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In memoriam

A Sustained Vote: Curtis Strobeck's Enduring Love for Music

Curtis Strobeck was a dedicated academic and champion of symphonic music. Born in Powers Lake, North Dakota, Curtis's journey took him from the plains of Montana, to CalTech, to the University of Chicago, and ultimately to his academic home at the University of Alberta, where he served from 1976 to 2005.

Curtis's research in population genetics, molecular ecology and wildlife forensics was groundbreaking. He pioneered a method for tracking wild bears using DNA extracted from hair samples — a technique that revolutionized wildlife management and led to the founding of Wildlife Genetics International in Nelson, B.C.

Curtis also had a deep and enduring love for music. A devoted supporter of the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra, he attended performances at the Winspear Centre and contributed monthly to initiatives that helped sustain classical music in the community. He was a welcomed sight at many annual Winspear events, including Light Up the Winspear and Musicalitea.
