
Baltit Fort:

Attabad Lake:

Attabad Lake, a breathtaking blue gem in Hunza Valley, was formed after a huge landslide in January 2010. Stretching about 29 kilometers, its deep waters reach over 300 feet, creating a stunning lake that draws visitors from around the world. Today, it's one of Pakistan's top tourist spots, perfect for boating, fishing, and photography.



Sost:

Sost, the last village in Pakistan on the Karakoram Highway, is a vibrant trade hub with China. The village celebrates local and Western cultures and offers a unique blend of traditional hospitality. Sost's peaceful vibe makes it a safe and enriching destination.



Passu Cones:

CHAPSHURO

A local meat-filled flatbread, often stuffed with minced meat, onions, and spices, then baked to perfection.





DIRAM PHITTI

A sweet bread made from wheat and apricot oil, served especially in winter for warmth and energy.



MAMTU

Hunza's version of dumplings, filled with minced meat and vegetables, steamed and often enjoyed with yogurt.



BURUS BERIKUTZ

A savory flatbread topped with local cheese, herbs, and sometimes apricots, offering a unique blend of flavors.

HARISSA

A hearty meat and wheat porridge, slow-cooked with spices for a comforting, warm dish, especially in colder months.





DAUDO SOUP

Daudo is a winter apricot soup from Hunza, made with dried apricots, sugar, water, and lemon. It's known to help with colds and digestion, making it a popular seasonal remedy.



GIYALING

A type of pancake made from whole grain flour, often served with butter, honey, or apricot jam.






BALAY (BROTH)
