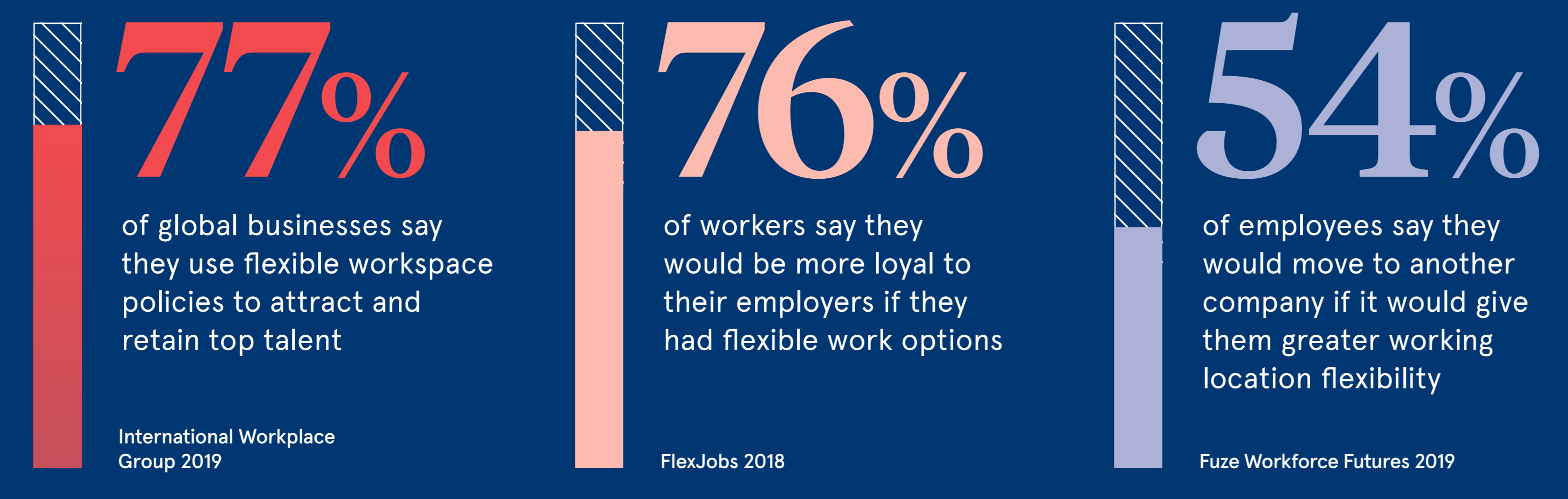
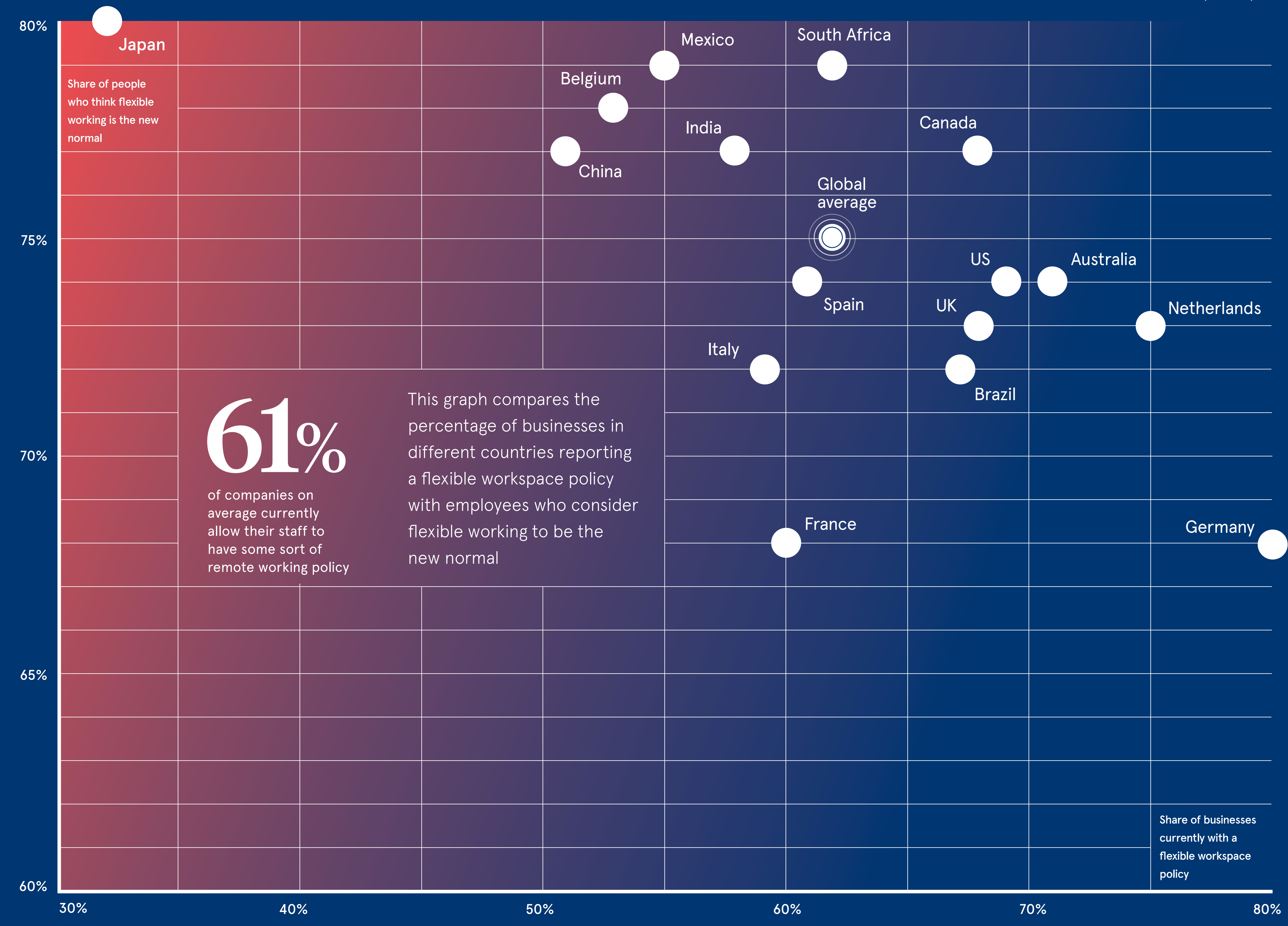


SHOULD REMOTE WORKING BE HERE TO STAY?

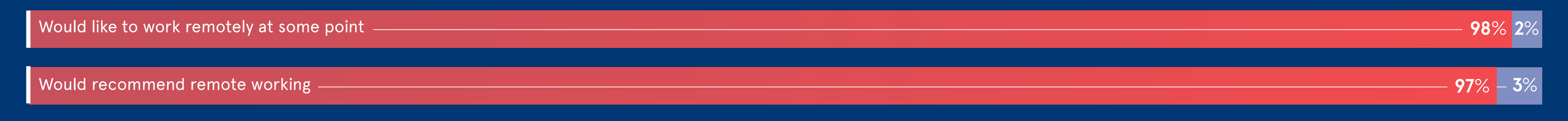

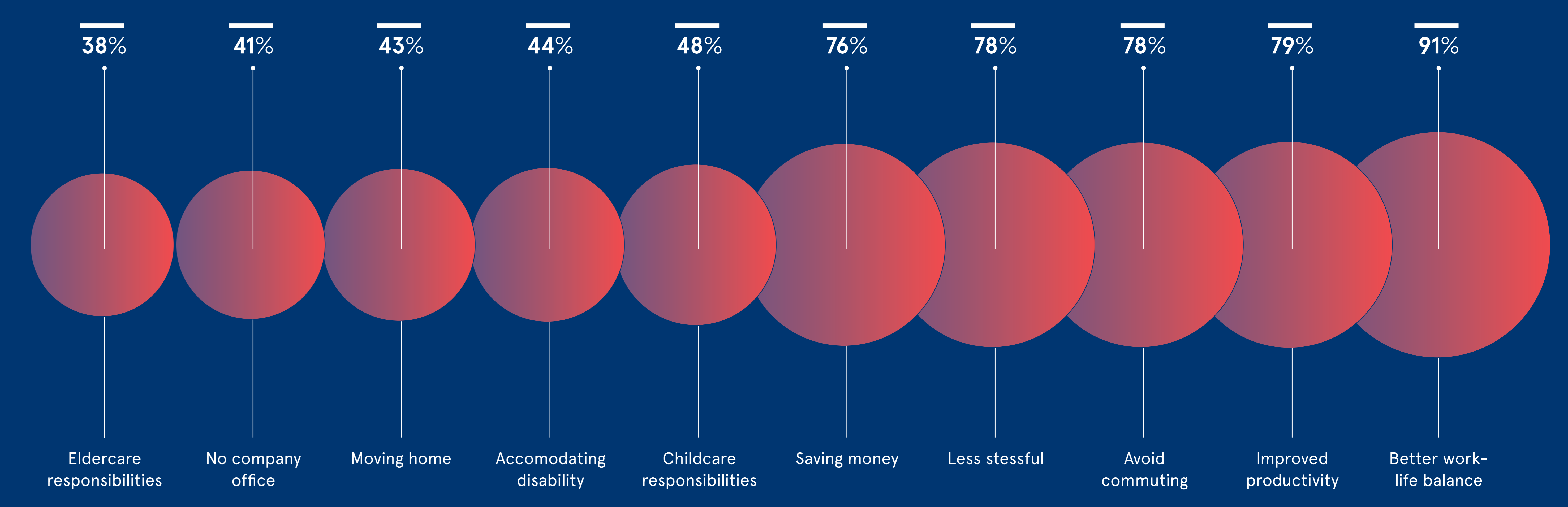

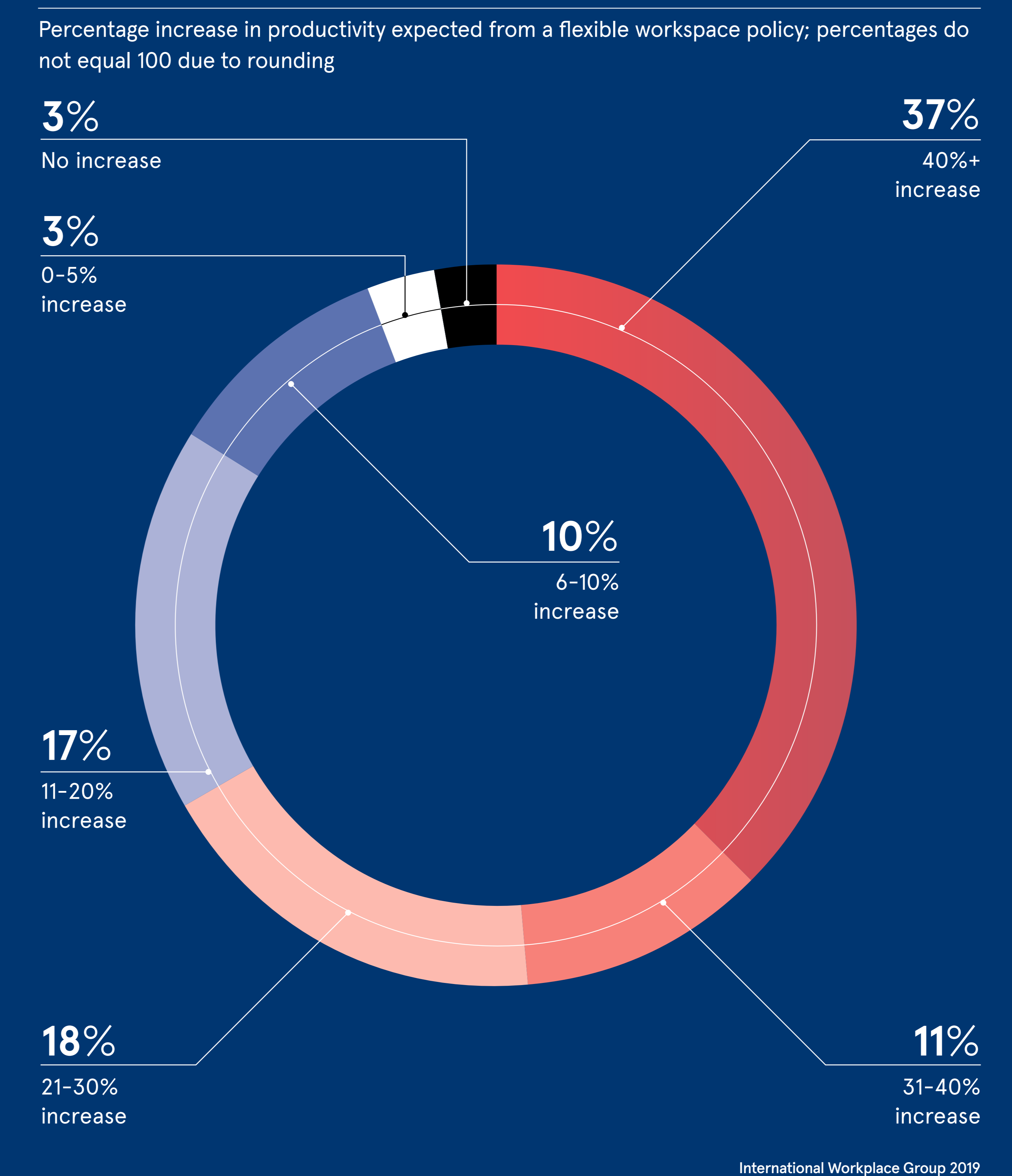
NEARLY ALL EMPLOYEES ARE IN FAVOUR OF SOME DEGREE OF REMOTE WORKING
